

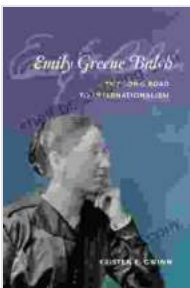
Emily Greene Balch: The Long Road to Internationalism

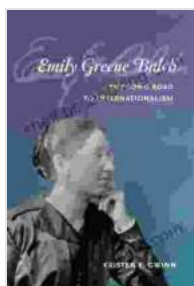

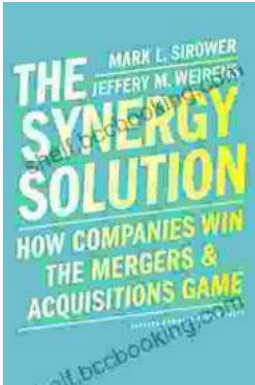

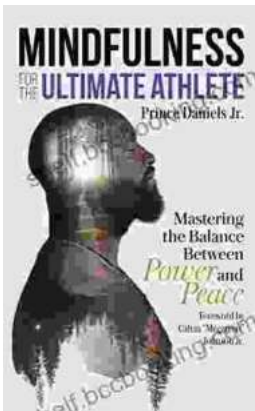
