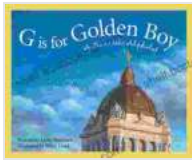

C is for Churchill



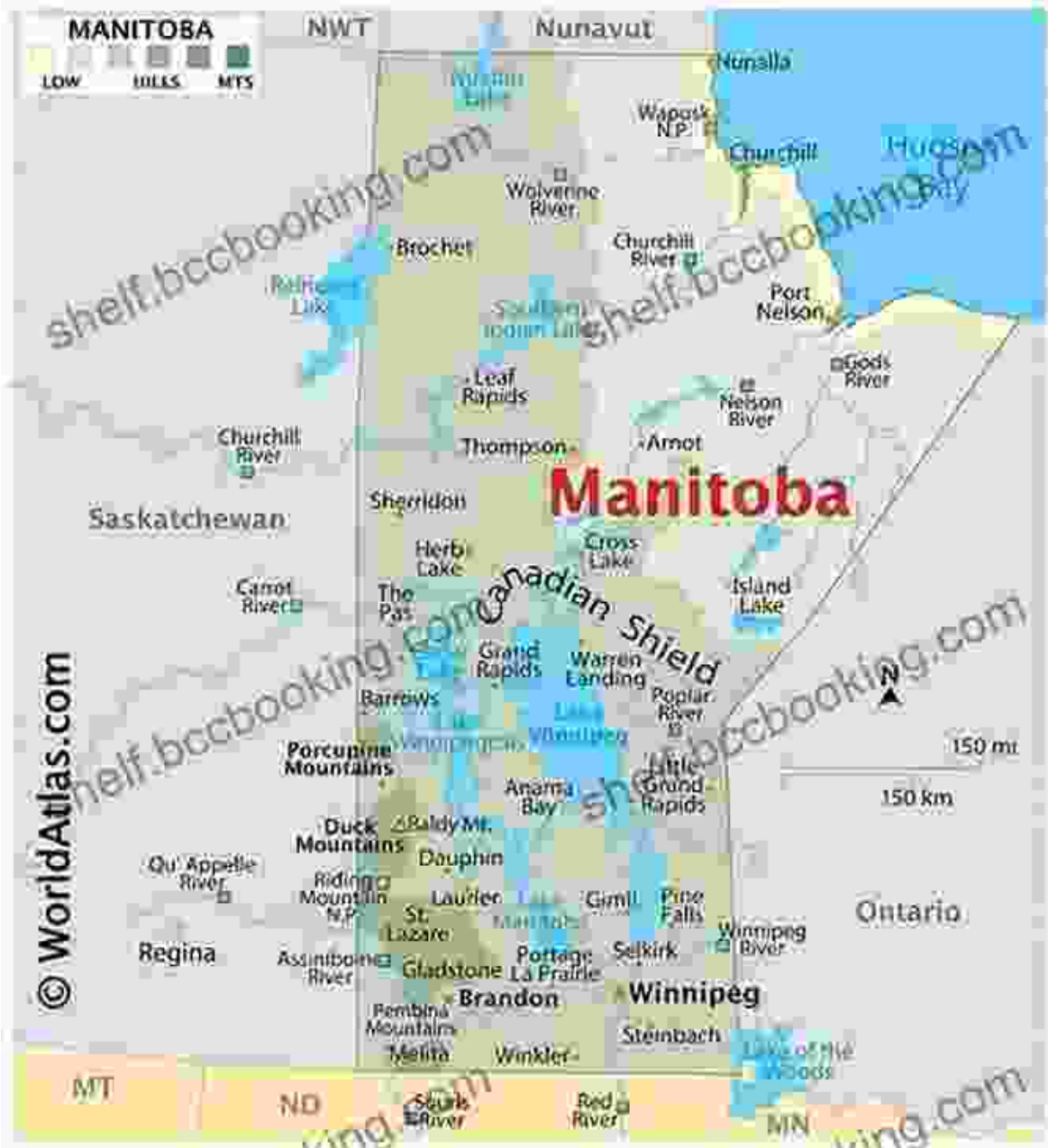

J is for Jets

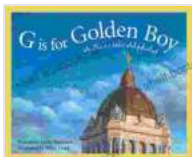
